

### **MVWC Service Project FAQs**

### 1. What exactly is the history of the MVWC Service Project?

Back in 2013, the leadership of the Moon Valley Women's Club realized it had grown beyond its roots as a Garden Club and needed to formalize the generosity of its membership. As a result, the MVWC Service Project was formed - to provide a clear channel for the generosity of Moon Valley Women's Club members. In 2018 the founding members of the MVWC Service Project Board applied for an IRS 501(c)3 designation for the MVWC Service Project and filed the requisite paperwork with the Arizona Corporation Commission. Once done, the MVWC Service Project became a separate legal entity from the Moon Valley Women's Club (a 501(c)7 organization) with a separate Board, a separate bank account, a separate logo and separate Bylaws. Of course, there is much interaction between the two entities known as the Moon Valley Women's Club and the MVWC Service Project but all the accounting is kept strictly separate per IRS regulations.

# 2. How much has the MVWC Service Project Board awarded in grants to the community?

The MVWC Service Project grant program to the community has grown significantly since its inception. To date (June 2023) the MVWC Service Project has awarded grants totaling in excess of \$92,000 from funds raised by Moon Valley Women's Club members. ### 3. What does the MVWC Service Project Board do?

The MVWC Service Project is organized exclusively for charitable purposes. Its purpose is to select recipients and award funds or goods to organizations that have been sponsored by a Moon Valley Women's Club member and that have completed the application process successfully. Meetings are scheduled as needed but at least quarterly.

# 4. How much has been raised by Moon Valley Women's Club members in the 2022-2023 Club year?

- Fundraisers include Wildflower in May and November, Serafina in September, Bonfire (merchandise +), GotSneakers, Barro's, Chipotle, Panera, See's, Dream Dinners, May Raffle, Amazon, Classy Cooks, Lions Club and Giving Tuesday in November have netted \$8,461.35
- The Christmas Adoption Project netted \$6,500
  <u>The total raised this Club year by Moon Valley Women's Club members and</u> <u>friends is an impressive \$14,961.35</u>
