

Revised Standing Rules

At the Board meeting held October 4th, the Board voted to revise Standing Rules #9 and #11 regarding membership.

Membership

Old:

9. The use of MVWC and its membership data for the sole purpose of soliciting business is not permissible. Members shall not distribute promotional materials during events, except as permitted for sponsors and with prior Executive Board approval.

New:

9. The use of MVWC and its membership data and communication channels for the sole purpose of soliciting business is not permissible. Members shall not distribute promotional materials during events or online except as permitted for sponsors and with prior Executive Board approval.

Old.

11. No member shall conduct a business or represent a charitable interest for personal gain within the framework of MVWC.

New.

11. No member shall conduct a business or represent a charitable interest within the framework of MVWC.

Did you know that October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month? We need your travel size toiletries!

Chicanos Por La Causa (CPLC) De Colores Shelter opened its doors in 1986 out of community-identified need for a domestic violence shelter that would provide an environment that was culturally and linguistically appropriate for monolingual Spanish speaking survivors and their children, many of whom are isolated from their families and traditional networks of support.

The shelter, located in south central Phoenix, serves and average of 500-600 clients a year recovering from abuse and ready to start a life free of violence.

Help for Holiday Family Adoption Project

The MVWC Service Project Board recently allotted partial funding for the Holiday Family Adoption project. With your help and generosity, we can make the holidays happen for 40 families from two local schools—Sunnyslope K-8 and Moon Mountain Elementary. This year, each school family will be assigned to a volunteer shopper. Items procured will be labeled by family name and delivered to the schools on December 11th to Wednesday, December 13th.

There are three ways to assist:

- Adopt one or more families and shop/pay for the requested items at a store of your choice/ at your leisure as your donation.
- Adopt one or more families and shop using gift cards or reimbursement provided by the MVWC Service Project Board.
- Donate money for this project.

Each family consists of parents and children (from 2 to 7 family members) and volunteers are provided with a list of clothing & shoe sizes and a toy or gift request for each child, and a household gift request from the parent(s).




