These large grants were all given to organizations that were sponsored by a member of MVWC. We want to thank our members who sponsored 13 grants, but unfortunately, we couldn't grant all of them. The Service Project Board met on October 10th, and we are thrilled to share the following Large Grant details:

**\$2,500 to AZ Reach** to purchase clothes, shoes, hygiene items and snacks for Cesar's Closet at Cesar Chavez High School.

**\$1,000 to Arizona Recreation Center for the Handicapped (ARCH)** to purchase medical assessment equipment and sports equipment for Special Olympics athletes.

**\$1,000 to Control Alt Delete** to purchase fuel cards for domestic violence victims.

**\$2,500 to HART Pantry** to purchase shelf stable food for homeless and atrisk teen students in 4 west valley school Districts including Glendale Union High Schools (Thunderbird High).

7. Duties of Executive Board, General Board, and Committees shall be outlined in an Addendum to the Standing Rules.

#### New Standing Rule:

8. Current Executive and General Board members who miss three (3) or more General Board meetings during the program year may be removed from their position at the discretion of the President.

This is in the Bylaws already:

General Board meetings shall be held once a month, when necessary, either in-person or virtually.

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#### **Holiday Family Adoption Project**

#### Monday Morning Walking Group




