November's Guest Speaker: Kimberly Yee



Kimberly Yee is currently serving as the 45th Arizona State Treasurer. She is the first Asian-American woman elected to the Arizona State Legislature.

She was elected to the Arizona House of Representatives for the 10th legislative district from 2011 to 2013 and the Arizona Senate for the 20th legislative district from 2013 until 2019. Yee was elected to the position of Arizona State Treasurer on November 6, 2018.

Yee was born and raised in Phoenix. She traces her ancestry to Taishan, Guangdong.Yee attended Greenway High School in Phoenix where she was a student journalist in the early 1990s. She is a graduate of Pepperdine University where she earned a bachelor's degree in political science and a bachelor's degree in English. She also holds a master's degree in public administration from Arizona State University's School of Public Affairs, and was the recipient of the honored Scholar-Citizen Award.

There are three ways to help:

The Biltmore's architectural structure has a strong Frank Lloyd Wright influence with special patented block design and gold ceilings. We toured the amazing grounds, the beautiful Gardens, special rooms, that had been occupied by big stars, banquet facilities, lounge, pools, bridges, and beautiful views from a variety of different areas around the hotel. A note on some of the history of this iconic hotel, as follows. On February 23, 1929, the Arizona Biltmore opened in grand fashion. There were over 600 invitations sent out,

with the thought that only a few hundred would be in attendance. However, it seemed no one wanted to be left out. The one-day planned Grand Opening event turned into three days of grand opening celebrations, in order to accommodate all the people requesting to attend. From that day forward, the Arizona Biltmore has been a private retreat for some very influential people, such as US Presidents, Dignitaries, Clark Gable, Marilyn Monroe, Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Sammy Davis



Jr, Stevie Nicks, socialites, sport teams, etc. This was an exceptional outing, along with legendary history.

Black musician---and their families. "They confront history's contradictions of wealth and poverty, freedom and prejudice, hope and despair, and what it means to live in America." We were amazed at the precision of the choreography, especially when all 32 cast members were dancing on the relatively small stage at the same time. The story was very powerful and moving; the acting was professional, and the singing was amazing! We were especially impressed with The Mother (whose costumes and singing were equally beautiful) and Coalhouse (the Black character who was first footloose and carefree, then happy in love, then turned into a terrorist after encountering prejudice and the murder of his wife). He moved all of us with his impressive singing of the two powerful anthems most will remember from this show (Wheels of a Dream, and Make Them Hear You). We were so very glad we made the trip to see this excellent production.

cinnamon rolls, a peanut butter chocolate candy and Doubletree chocolate chip cookies. Next month we will be making and tasting soups, breads and crack-


